

Nursing home not allowed to take in new patients

THAI teenager Peneakchanasak Nitcharee, who lost both legs after falling onto MRT tracks in Ang Mo Kio, will go home on Monday.

Her father, Mr Kittanesh Peneakchanasak, said on Saturday she misses her friends back home, and felt she would be able to recuperate there. Another reason: Nitcharee's 15th birthday is coming soon.

She was in good spirits yesterday at the hospital , fiddling with her new electric wheelchair , bought yesterday.

Her departure will mark a temporary end to an eventful journey for Thai teen who came to Singapore in March for a holiday and to brush up her English . While here , she lost her pair of leg and they were crushed by an MRT train . Although she fell onto the tracks , she didn't faint , her father said.

The family has yet to fully settle matters here. SMRT had offered them 5000 dollar which he has rejected . He was upset that this amount was "unacceptable " .Her father said ,From today onwards, there will be more expense, like the cost of her new legs .
